Union of Presentation Sisters

The Leadership Team are elected every six years at the Congregational Gathering. They are based in Monasterevan, Co. Kildare, Ireland and minister to the Congregation worldwide.

Nano Nagle began her life in Ballygriffin, Co Cork, Ireland. When she died her companions continued her work with and for the poor people of Ireland. Remember one of Nano's sayings, "if I could be of service in any part of the globe, I would gladly go"... Her Congregation spread throughout the world. We celebrate our IPA, International Presentation Congregation, The Union of Presentation Sisters, The American Conference and the Australian Society. The Union of Presentation Sisters began forty years ago.

The **Presentation Sisters**, also known as the **Sisters of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary** are a group of women founded in Cock, Ireland, by Nano (Honorina) Nagle in 1775. The Sisters of the congregation use the postnominal initials of **P.B.V.M.**

The Presentation Sisters are located in 24 countries including Antigua, Australia, Bolivia, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Commonwealth of Dominica, Ecuador, England, Guatemala, India, Ireland, Isreal, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Peru, Philippines, Slovakia, Thailand, United States of America, Zambia and Zimbabwe. The Presentation Sisters have helped people worldwide, mainly the poor and needy.

The Union of Presentation Sisters is a congregation of 1300 women working internationally in fourteen units. Each unit takes responsibility for its own life and mission in response to the direction of the congregation.

Four pioneering Sisters among Nano's followers, Sisters Bernard Kirwin, Magdalen O'Shaughnessy, Xavier Maloney and Xaverius Lynch, carried her vision and spirit the shores of Newfoundland in 1833. They came at the invitation of Bishop Michael Fleming to establish a school that would offer improved educational opportunity for girls and young women in St. John's. Nano's vision had birthed a response that was both broad and penetrating. For the next 175 years our sisters continued to respond to this call. Academic learning, spiritual development/religious education and a deep appreciation for the arts and music were central to our education ministry among students, teachers and parents. Nano's spirit, the spirit of these four women and those who followed them, continue to guide us as we endeavour in new ways to meet today's emerging needs.
